Liz Reilly is an Advanced Clinical Practitioner (ACP) who works in a primary care (PC) setting at Salford Primary Care Together (SPCT). She believes that ACP provides clinicians with the ability to draw on:

- A diverse range of clinical skills and advance communication
- An understanding of evidence based, analytical capabilities
- A good appreciation of change management

These all result in a positive and powerful driving force to transform and improve patient experiences.

Advanced Practitioners provide resilience, role modelling, inspiration, and influence to support capacity and capability that will improve, integrate and co-ordinate patient care. Liz is also a Training Programme Director for HEE and has been working with stakeholders to support the development of our qualified ACPs to become confident and capable supervisors for trainee ACPs. She believes that ACPs are more vital to the workforce than ever and ACP Supervisors will help them to flourish.

In her ACP role at SPCT Liz utilises her experience and ACP training, acting as a point of contact to support and embed new roles into PC. She develops and enhances the capabilities of the post-graduate non-medical workforce to make a difference to their patient's experiences of care, through effective leadership, education and continuous quality improvement.

Clinically Liz provides expertise in complex long term conditions and rehabilitative management of vulnerable patients. She reviews and gives advice on personalised management plans created for complex patients.

She integrates the leadership pillar of ACP by supervising and mentoring to facilitate staff into PC, new roles or services. Educationally, she is the lead on the coordination and delivery of programmes and delivers bespoke education packages for trainee ACPs. Liz also acts as a resource on quality improvement, audits, service redesign, and the implementation of research findings. In doing so she works across the 4 pillars of ACP on a daily basis.




