The forum may link with other proposed forums where shared agenda items or learning needs are identified.




Outcomes

The forum met for the first time on 15.3.23. 22 ACPs/tACPs attended from multiple organisations. There was clear enthusiasm regarding the potential benefits. Predicted attendance in May is 42.



Conclusions/impact

It is hoped that the forum will provide valuable peer support for those in challenging & potentially isolating roles. The forum will impact personal development in all 4 pillars of advanced practice. It will allow opportunity for development of clinical skills (via shared CPD activities), education (via provision of a safe space for peer presentations), research skills (via sharing of professional curiosity) and leadership (via shared agendas and rotating chair opportunities).



Helpful links were made with those running a forum in Lancashire and South Cumbria. Draft terms of

reference were written. A presentation was made at the Cheshire and Merseyside AP leads meeting. A flier was created and distributed via AP leads and Community Ambassadors.
