

#### **ACPs in Surgical Same Day Emergency Care (SDEC)**

ACPs offer senior assessment to surgical patients and have changed the face of emergency surgical assessment and care.


- History taking

- Minor surgical procedures





## **Expanding surgical SDEC**

- 500% increase in patients per week in 6 years
- 2 full time ACPs up to 5
- 2 additional specialities (Urology & ENT)

As part of a Health Education England (HEE) pilot, 2 ACPs from surgical SDEC were involved in the supervision of FY1 doctors. Local feedback was 100% positive and the pilot has been extended.


#### Research

### **Feedback Results**



#### Patient and staff satisfaction

Through the collection of qualitative data via Microsoft forms we were able to demonstrate high levels of patient satisfaction, as 85% of patients were very satisfied with the service, and 15% somewhat satisfied.

ACP satisfaction was also demonstrated as 100% felt clinically supported by Consultants, and felt they had an appropriate level of clinical autonomy.
