## **Advanced Practitioner**

Dr Jessica di Gesso – Advanced Clinical Practitioner in Acute Medicine

## Jessica is an Advanced Clinical Practitioner working in Acute Medicine at Cambridge University Hospitals NHS Trust



Jessica started her healthcare career as a pharmacy assistant, going on to complete a Masters degree in pharmacy. Whilst working as a community pharmacist and pharmacy manager, Jessica studied for a PGDip in General Pharmacy Practice and was inspired by this experience to go onto accomplish a PhD in Molecular Pharmacology and Nutritional Medicine. Jessica enjoyed her time researching but missed being patient-facing so joined Addenbrooke's Hospital as a band 6 pharmacist and shortly moved to a band 7 position in the emergency department. Whilst undertaking her non-medical prescriber certification Jessica met an advanced clinical practitioner who inspired her to become an advanced practitioner herself so that she could fully utilise her skills.

In her advanced practitioner role Jessica has clinical expertise in pharmaceuticals and undertakes a range of clinical practice, such as: comprehensive physical examinations, prescribing medications, taking bloods, removing cannulas, inserting catheters, she is currently learning to perform chest drains and lumbar punctures.

Jessica has clinical leadership responsibilities within her role; she leads and supervises the junior medical team (when there is not a consultant on the ward) and provides expert pharmaceutical advice to her colleagues.

Jessica supports the education of junior medical staff; she trains them to use medical equipment and hospital systems and coaches them when they need advice on medical issues. She also provides advice to the wider team on pharmaceuticals.

In her role, Jessica participates in audits and has also led on an audit. Jessica plans to undertake more research within her advanced practice role in the future, specifically on identifying system issues that can have a detriment to patient experience.

People come to Jessica for small problems and big problems alike which makes her feel useful and appreciated. As someone who loves improving patient experience and expediting tasks, Jessica also believes that she is good at encouraging others and helping them to shine; she gains joy seeing someone increase in confidence and flourish.
